DR. MARIEKA SAX

"The Open Veins of British Columbia: Liquefied natural gas development from the perspective of Latin American extractivism"

Marieka Sax is a Postdoctoral Fellow (Geography Program) and Research Lead (Cumulative Impacts Research Consortium) at the University of Northern British Columbia. She holds a PhD and MA in Anthropology from Carleton University. Her present work explores resource extraction, indigenous-settler relations, gender, and rural livelihoods in northern British Columbia. This builds on her earlier research on small-scale agriculture, traditional medicine, sacred landscapes, and indigeneity in the Peruvian Andes. Connecting these projects in Latin America and Canada is an ongoing interest in socially reproduced cultural understandings of wellbeing and the good life.
